Legal and Current Visa Status (e.g. F1 Academic Visa)

H-1B Visa (e.g. DACA), Graduate of Utah High School

Are the scholarships full-tuition?

\$2000 for the year (\$1000 for Fall and \$1000 for Spring)

A one-year scholarship or tuition award generally implies that students start in the Fall and end in the Spring.
