

According to the College Board,

“The only requirements are a strong curiosity about the subject you plan to study and the willingness to work hard. Through **Advanced Placement (AP) exams**, you have the opportunity to earn credit or advanced standing at most of the nation's colleges and universities.

With 37 courses and exams across 22 subject areas, AP offers something for everyone.” Regardless of your grade level, these opportunities await you.

Advanced Placement classes are available for students who would like to put their high school career

on a fast track or have the opportunity to take college-level courses while attending secondary school. AP courses are invariably more rigorous than other high school offerings. To participate in an AP class is to enter a world of intense discussions and thought.

AP classes are taught in the high school by present high school teachers. Course offerings will vary from district to district, so ask your high school counselor about the opportunities and requirements.
