PURPOSE AND MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

#### **Purpose**

The Elementary Music Specialist Endorsement (Level II) is for teachers who are basically college music majors, and as such, knowledgeable and skilled in music, and who also desire to establish themselves as a fully qualified music specialist for elementary students. Candidates will choose university courses, professional workshops, conferences, and activities as needed to qualify for the endorsement.

Course availability of all courses changes, as well as procedures for being admitted into them.
