Utah State Board of Education (USBE) Youth In Custody (YIC), Prevention and Safe and Healthy School teams Professional Learning (PL) Offerings for Check & Connect (C&C) Mentors and related Local Education Agency (LEA) staff.

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Check & Connect (C&C) Mentor Program Trainings:

Utah's YIC and Prevention Mentors use the C&C Mentor Program to support K-12 youth by providing evidence-based interventions. Mentor support improves student engagement at school with learning, through relationship building, problem-solving, capacity building, and persistence. It has four components:

- Mentors—a mentor who works with students, families, caseworkers, school, and other agency personnel.
- Check—regular checks, utilizing data schools already collect on students' school adjustment, behavior, and educational progress.
- Connect—timely interventions, driven by data, to reestablish and maintain students' connection to school and learning and to enhance students' social and academic competencies.
- Family Engagement—mentors engage with parents, guardians, and families to foster their active participation in their student's education.

Initial C&C Mentor Training – Two-day in-depth training designed to provide LEA staff with the information, competencies, and skills needed to be an effective YIC or Prevention C&C mentor.

- Training Objectives:
 - Participants will learn about and understand— The core components and elements of Check & Connect.
 - The role and expectations of the Check & Connect mentor.
 - How to best meet the needs of the population of students they are mentoring.
 - How to implement the "Check" and "Connect" procedures with fidelity.
 - The competencies and skills needed to be an effective mentor, such as: Building relationships with students, families, and school personnel. Using data to determine interventions, problem–solving with students, and engaging with families.
- Who Should Attend: The Initial C&C Mentor Training is designed for those assigned the role of C&C Mentor as well as those interested in C&C mentoring principles and practices. C&C site coordinators and administrators are also encouraged to attend, after they have participated in a Preparation and Implementation Training. Note: All YIC Mentors must participate in the Initial C&C Mentor Training at least once. Ideally prior to working with students.

Preparation and Implementation Training – The Check & Connect Preparation & Implementation Training provides administrators and leadership teams with a thorough overview of the intervention and how to prepare their site for implementing with fidelity.

- Training Objectives:
 - The core components and elements of Check & Connect.
 - The context for Check & Connect, including the process of disengagement.
 - How Check & Connect was developed, including its theoretical underpinnings.
 - Steps for preparing for and implementing Check & Connect at their sites:
 - Aligning Check & Connect with current initiatives.
 - Identifying the indicators of disengagement at their site.
 - Designating a coordinator and hiring mentors.
 - Systematically monitoring student data and identifying appropriate interventions for reengaging students.
 - Strengthening the family-school relationship.
 - Monitoring the person-environment fit.
 - Evaluating the implementation and effectiveness of Check & Connect at their site.
- Who Should Attend: Preparation & Implementation Training is designed for administrators and/or leadership teams interested in preparing for and implementing Check & Connect. As well as:
 - YIC Directors and related staff who are new to the C&C mentor program.
 - LEA and/or site-based administrators exploring this student engagement intervention.
 - Administrators preparing to implement the program.
 - This training content is not designed for mentors.

Utah Mentor Refresher Training – The USBE YIC and Prevention staff have created a Utahspecific Mentor Refresher Training that takes a deeper dive into the mentor tools, such as the 5-Minute Mentor Activities, and strategies used in the C&C Mentor Program Model. As well as providing time for participants to share what is working with their students or ask implementation questions of the local certified C&C trainers and other mentors.

- Who Should Attend: The Utah Mentor Refresher Training is for new mentors who have previously participated in initial two-day C&C Mentor Training, and experienced mentors who would like a refresher and updates on what is working in Utah.
 - Please note, USBE strongly recommends those who are C&C trained attend either the refresher or initial mentor training at least once annually.

YIC Mentor Webinars:

This YIC Webinar Series is designed to provide customized PL opportunities for C&C mentors who support YIC and other at-risk students throughout the State. Each online seminar session starts with the YIC Program Specialist sharing a mindfulness technique or activity that participants can incorporate into their practices, followed by guest presenter(s) who share their expertise on a wide range of topics. To date, the YIC Program Specialist has hosted 34 of these webinars which have attracted a variety of LEA participants, such as YIC and Prevention mentors, YIC Directors and Program Coordinators, Education Specialists, School Counselors, and more.

Each month the YIC Program Specialist sends email invites and reminders to the LEA YIC staff, and other LEA staff who have participated in C&C Trainings. The invites include the Zoom meeting links and Session Agendas.
