What is the School Safety Center?

The Utah State Board of Education **School Safety Center (SSC)** is a partnership of state agencies advancing the physical safety and well-being of Utah's communities by reviewing data and providing technical assistance, developing resources, trainings, and materials that promote school safety.

Most Utahns Feel Schools are Safe

- 87%** | Students in grade 6-12 feel safe at school
- 94%** | Teachers feel safe at school
- 95%** | Parents feel their child is safe at school
