
2017 Reading State Snapshot Report

Utah • Grade 8 • Public Schools

Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of eighth-grade students in Utah was 269. This was higher than the average score of 265 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Utah in 2017 (269) was not significantly different from their average score in 2015 (269) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (263).
- The percentage of students in Utah who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 38 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (38 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (31 percent).
- The percentage of students in Utah who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 79 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (81 percent) and in 1998 (77 percent).





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2017, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (21 points).
- In 2017, female students in Utah had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 8 points.
- In 2017, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (20 points).
