4. Action on Legislation/Budget

4.1. POTENTIAL ACTION: Board Positions on Legislation

Angie Stallings, Deputy Superintendent of Policy, reviewed bills and answered board members' questions.

MOTION was made by Member Reale and seconded by Member Lear that the Board instruct staff to work with the bill sponsor of <u>HB 112</u> -- Sex Education Instruction Amendments (Rep. Jimenez, T.) to amend the bill by adding the following language after line 45:

(b) Notwithstanding receipt of the consent described in Subsection (2)(a), a school may not provide sex education instruction that violates provisions described in Section 53G-10-402.

The motion carried with Members Boggess, Earl, Green, Kerry, and Moss opposed.

MOTION was made by Member Davis and seconded by Member Wood that the Board directs staff to work with the sponsor of HB 491 Data Privacy Amendments, Rep. Jefferson Moss, to include the following language, or similarly worded language, to the bill:

302 (b) (i) If a governmental entity is subject to a more restrictive or specific **provision of**

303 law than found in this **part** <u>chapter</u>, the governmental entity shall comply with the more restrictive or

304 specific provision of law.

305 (ii) For purposes of Subsection (1)(b)(i), the following are more restrictive and specific laws:

(A)Title 63G, Chapter 2, Government Records Access and Management Act[, is a more restrictive and specific provision of law.];

(B) the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 34 C.F.R. Part 99; and (C) Title 53E, Chapter 9, Student Privacy and Data Protection.

The motion carried with Members Boggess, Green, Hymas, Kerry, and Moss opposed.

MOTION was made by Member Earl and seconded by Member Boggess that the Board request staff to work with Representative Briscoe on HB 555, *School Policy Amendments:*

- 1. to add The last three paragraphs from Herman Melville's "The Lightening Rod Man";
- 2. The third to last paragraph of the Declaration of Independence; and
- 3. His favorite verse from Neil Diamond's Patriotic song, "America".

The motion carried with Members Wood and Hymas opposed. Members Davis, Green, Kerry, and Strate abstained.

5. Adjournment

Motion made by Member Hymas and seconded by Member Lear that the Board adjourns. The meeting adjourned at 1:45 p.m.
