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Board Makes Recommendations to the P-12 Mathematics Standards Writing Committee

The Utah State Board of Education was presented with the P-12 Mathematics Standards Review Committee Report, which provided recommendations for revisions to

the P-12 mathematics standards. Following the committee's presentation, the Board voted to adopt the committee's recommendations with revisions, including considering applying the key components of the 1997 California state math standards. The recommendations will now be delivered to a writing committee, who will use the recommendations, along with <u>Recommendations for Utah Math Standards</u> from the Board, to begin the process of writing the P-12 mathematics standards.

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Board Revises Legislative Funding Requests for Utah K-12 Schools

The Utah State Board of Education has revisited the <u>legislative funding request priorities</u> for the 2024 legislative session. The Weighted Pupil Unit (WPU) funding request will be adjusted to six percent total. Staff has been directed to fervently advocate for the traditional Beverley Taylor Sorenson (BTS) funding model, but remove the Educator Salary Adjustment portion from the state provided salary allocations related to the BTSA program.

 This rule is being amended to delete section 13 from the rule.
- R277-486, Professional Staff Cost Program. This rule is being amended to strike the prohibition on Line 42 of funding WPUs for an LEA's interns.
- R277-308, New Educator Induction and Mentoring. This rule is being continued upon its five-year review.
- R277-912, Law Enforcement Related Incident Reporting. This rule is being continued upon its five-year review.
- R277-910, Underage Drinking and Substance Abuse Prevention Program. This rule is being continued upon its five-year review.
