Board Approves Alternate Achievement Science

Standards for Students with Disabilities

The Utah State Board of Education approved the <u>alternate achievement science</u> <u>standards revision</u> discussed during the meeting. The Utah State Board of Education contracts with the Dynamic Learning Maps Consortia (DLM) to develop and assess Alternate Achievement Standards, known as Essential Elements (EEs), for students with significant cognitive disabilities. These EEs adapt the Core Standards to be

accessible for these students.

Currently, 4,509 students are enrolled in the DLM system for assessment; last year,

3,826 received a Mathematics score and 3,323 a Science score.

# New Administrative Rules, Amendments, and Repeals

The Utah State Board of Education approved, amended, or repealed the following administrative rules:

- R277-325, Public Education Exit and Engagement Surveys. This rule is being amended to clarify the language and resolve a conflict in how the engagement survey and school climate survey are administered.
- R277-100, Definitions for Utah State Board of Education Rules. This rule is being amended to update the definition of "accountability practices," which applies in all USBE rules.
- R277-311, Specialized Endorsements. This rule is being continued upon its five-year review.
- R277-731, Catalyst Center Grant Program Policy. This rule is being created to implement the Statewide Catalyst Campus Model Program as outlined in HB 447.
