

JASON GOBLE: Utah October 2023 CTE Teacher of the Month

We are pleased to announce that Jason Goble, agricultural teacher at North Sevier High School, in Sevier School District, has been selected as the October 2023 CTE Teacher of the Month. Jason is recognized as one of the best CTE teachers in the state of Utah. He makes a positive difference in the lives of the students he teaches. Jason enjoys seeing his students succeed a become successful.

BACKGROUND: Jason grew up in Nephi, Utah on his family's farm. On the farm there were beef cattle, sheep, alfalfa hay, and small grains.



AGRICULTURAL TEACHER: Jason not only teaches agriculture courses at Sevier High School he is also the FFA advisor of the North Sevier FFA Chapter. Jason serves on the Sevier County Farm Bureau Board, which allows him to coordinate Farm Bureau and FFA efforts in promoting agriculture. He also serves on the Southern Utah Junior Livestock Show Board. Jason enjoys taking his students on business visits to show them what future employment opportunities they have in the community.

STUDENT SUCCESS: Jason enjoys seeing his students succeed. He gives his students hands-on learning experiences such as operating farm equipment with the various activities of crop production, animal husbandry activities with livestock including selecting sires, managing a Forest Service grazing permit, and performing a necropsy on calves lost during birthing to determine cause of loss. Through these experiences students become successful agricultural students and leaders.

CLASSROOM: Jason's classroom is outdoors where students raise cattle and grow crops. Part of the hands-on learning experience is their participation in a small cattle operation. Jason guides his students as they develop skills on how to successfully take care of the cattle and grow and harvest a hay crop to feed them. He also teaches students how to utilize technology by using a drone to make management decisions on the cattle operation and hay farm.

"Construction is my passion and I have been interested in building for as long as I can remember. My mom always says that I was born with a paint brush in one hand and a hammer in the other.
