Welcome Back to a New School Year

With the beginning of a new school year comes planning and setting goals. Students, plan now to meet with your school counselor to create your plan for high school to college and career. Your school counselor can assist you as you plan your CTE classes throughout high school and your postsecondary options most relevant to your chosen career. Planning and preparing are key elements to your college and career success.



- Become a member of a <u>Career and Technical Student Organization</u> (CTSO).
- Juniors: Ask your school counselor if you are on track to become a CTE Pathway completer. (A CTE Pathway completer is eligible to receive a Secondary Pathway Completer Recognition Award at graduation.)
- Seniors: Apply for a CTE Scholarship and Tuition Award. The application goes live on November 1, 2024.
- Join the <u>UtahCTE.org</u> online communities—<u>X</u>, <u>Facebook</u>, and <u>Instagram</u>—to connect with CTE.

Special Populations

Each month, during the 2024-2025 school year Utah CTE will highlight evidence-based practices in special populations. The Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act (Perkins V) includes provisions that prioritize expanding access to and supporting success within CTE programs to designated special populations—students with disabilities, economically disadvantaged, nontraditional, single parents, out-of-workforce individuals, English learners, homelessness, youth in foster care, and youth with parent in the armed forces.

This month, encourage special population students to explore opportunities within Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSOs) to enhance their social networks and support systems.

In these evidence-based practices, here are several items to remember:

- Use Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSOs) as a way for students to build social capital and networks in which they feel welcome and supported.
- When working with economically disadvantaged families, including low-income youth and adults, provide free books, materials, tools, uniforms, and other resources necessary for

- materials, tools, uniforms, and other resources necessary for success in a CTE program. Pay dues, activity fees, and other costs for students who are low-income to participate in CTSOs.
- For English Learners, engage families and community in supporting English learners' engagement in CTE and CTSOs.
- For McKinney-Vento homeless student group, coordinate with school and community resources and approved partners for support with dues, activity fees, and transportation resources to support educational success in CTE and CTSOs.

With a new school year comes the arrival of the <u>2024-2025 CTE Career Pathways</u>. Students who focus on a Career Pathway acquire the skills necessary for entry into well-paid careers with high potential for rapid financial growth, increased levels of responsibility, and a high degree of personal satisfaction. Each Career Pathway aligns with and are categorized by the national Career Clusters, culminating in an industry recognized credential of value.

<u>Career Pathways Charts</u> – 32 Career Pathways charts outline the sequence of courses in a specific program of study, beginning in junior high/middle school, continuing through high school, and connecting to postsecondary education and training.
