Uses toilet and washes hands on their own

Balances on one foot for ten seconds

Counts objects by counting one at a time

Knows and shares their first and last name

Speaks clearly and effectively

Can use zippers, buttons, and ties

Hops, jumps, walks, runs



Knows parent's or guardian's first and last names

Recognizes and plays with rhyming words

Uses writing tools, and scissors correctly

Bounces, catches, kicks, and throws balls

Sorts similar items into groups or pairs

Separates from caregiver easily

Knows letters have specific sounds


Turns book pages carefully

Waits, listens, and replies to others

Draws pictures and talks about them



# Kindergarten, here we come!

Helping your child transition to kindergarten by providing plenty of chances to practice these skills is essential.

## Lifelong Learning Practices

Builds social skills through curiosity, independence, and problem-solving.

## Health Education

Teaches healthy habits that help children feel good and focus.

## Physical Education

Promotes fitness, teamwork, and confidence for a healthy lifestyle.

## English Language Arts

Develops reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills to share ideas and solve problems.

## Mathematics

Encourages problem-solving and discovering patterns through fun and curiosity.

## Public Kindergarten Entrance Requirements

- Must be five years old BEFORE September 2 of the enrolling year.
- Utah Code 53G-7-203 and Board Rule R277-631 require children to be toilet-trained before enrolling in kindergarten.
- Check with your local school district or charter for additional requirements.
