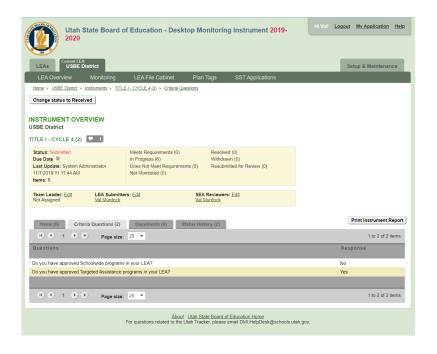

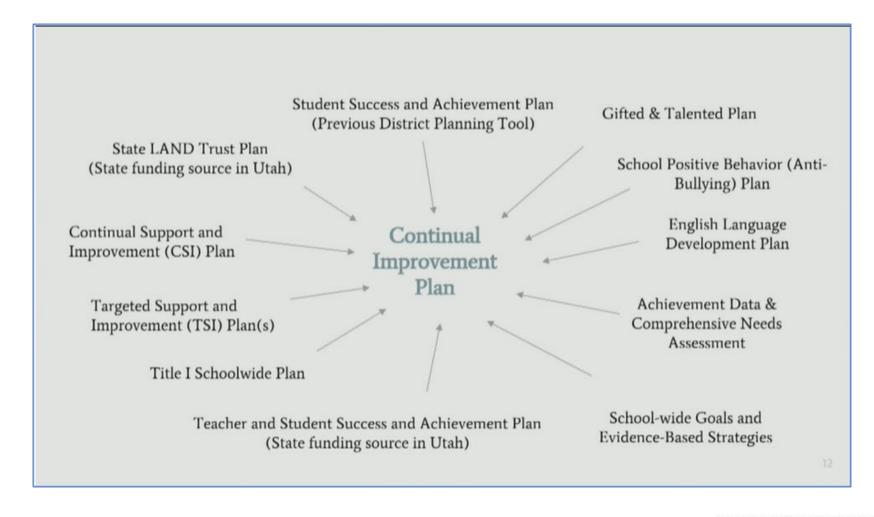

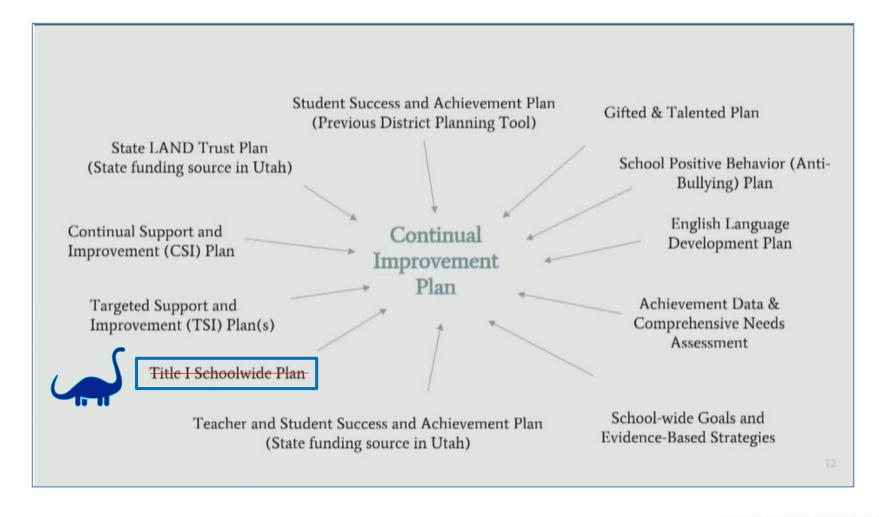

Targeted Assistance Program Requirements

A. Multiple, educationally related, objective criteria for identifying students with greatest need — ESEA Sec. 1115(a) and 1115(c)(1)(B)

Vs.

R277-708-2. "At-risk of academic failure" means a k-12 public school student who meets an LEA governing board's approved definition of at-risk of academic failure.



Targeted Assistance Program Sec. 1115(b)(4)

- A. Identify students who will be served
- B. Serve students identified as eligible by:
 - 1. Using resources to support identified students
 - 2. Using strategies to strengthen the academic program of the school
- C. Coordinate with and support the general education program
- D. Provide professional development
- E. Implement strategies to increase parent involvement
- F. Coordination and integration of services and programs



Targeted Assistance Program Sec. 1115(b)(4)

- G. Ensure the school:
 - 1. Provides an accelerated, high-quality curriculum;
 - 2. Minimizes the removal of children from the regular classroom
 - 3. On an ongoing basis, reviews the progress of eligible students

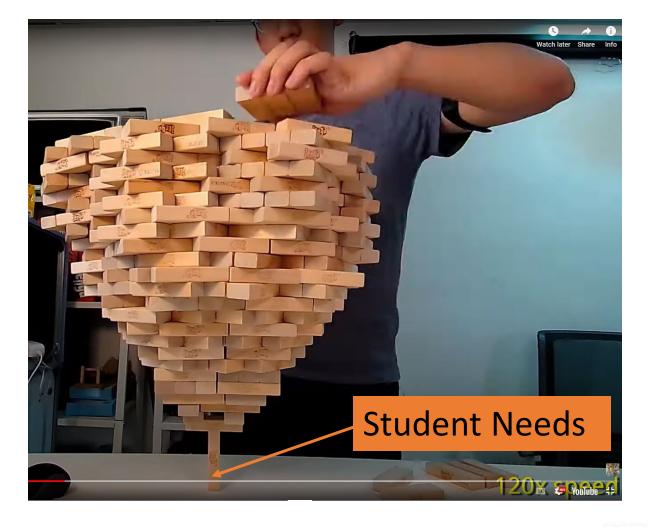
