Fitle I Elements of Consultation and Equitable Program Design ESEA Sec. 1117(b)(1))
The following elements must be addressed during the consultation process:
How the students' needs will be identified
What services will be offered
How, where, and by whom the services will be provided
How the services will be academically assessed and how the results of that assessment will be used to improve those services
The size and scope of the equitable services to be provided to eligible private school students, teachers, and other educational personnel, the proportion/amount of funds that are allocated for such services, and how that proportion/amount is determined
The method or sources of data that are used to determine the number of children from low- ncome families in participating school attendances areas who attend private schools
How and when the LEA will make decisions about the delivery of services to such children, including a thorough consideration and analysis of the views of the private school officials on the provision of services through a contract with potential third-party providers
How, if the LEA disagrees with the views of the private school officials on the provision of services through a contract, the LEA will provide in writing to such private school official an analysis of the reason why the LEA has chosen not to use a contractor
Whether the LEA shall provide services directly or through a separate government agency, consortium, entity, or third-party contractor  Whether to provide equitable services to eligible private school children (1) by creating a pool
