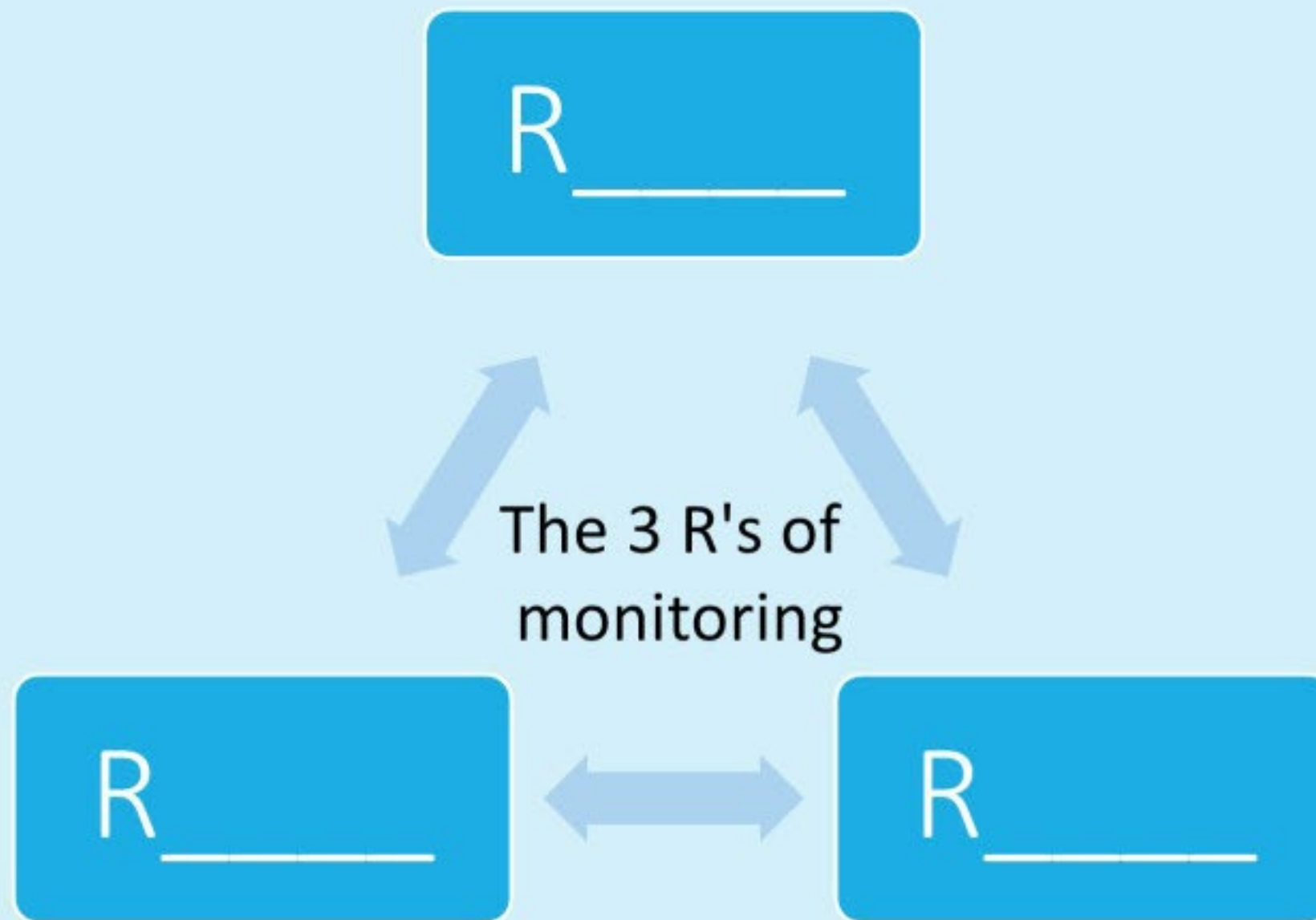

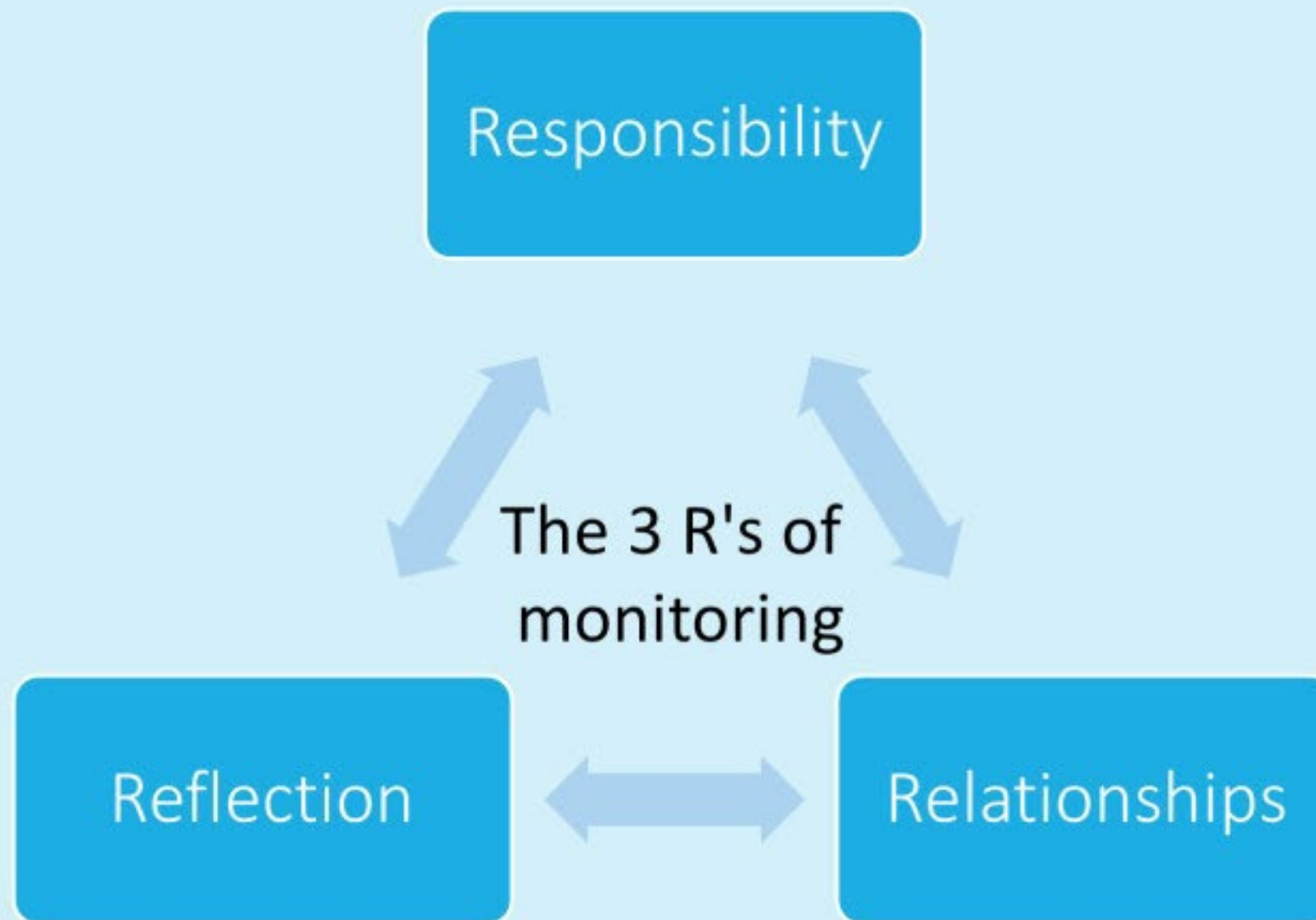

What is Title I?

Title I is a federal program that provides funding for some public schools. The number of students in a school receiving free and Elder School District that receive this assistance. This funding is in addition to the regular funds provided to all public schools.

What Does It Pay For?

Programmatic Monitoring



High-Risk Monitoring Visits

An LEA may be considered for technical assistance and/or monitoring for the following reasons:

1. Verified risk score is in the top 10 highest
2. Failed to resolve findings from a previous monitoring visit.
3. Had extensive findings from a previous monitoring visit and a follow-up is needed to ensure resolution.
4. Showed evidence of serious or chronic compliance problems.
5. Waived funds in the past.
6. Received complaints from parents and/or other stakeholders about program implementation.
7. Failed to respond to USBE requests for documentation and/or action.

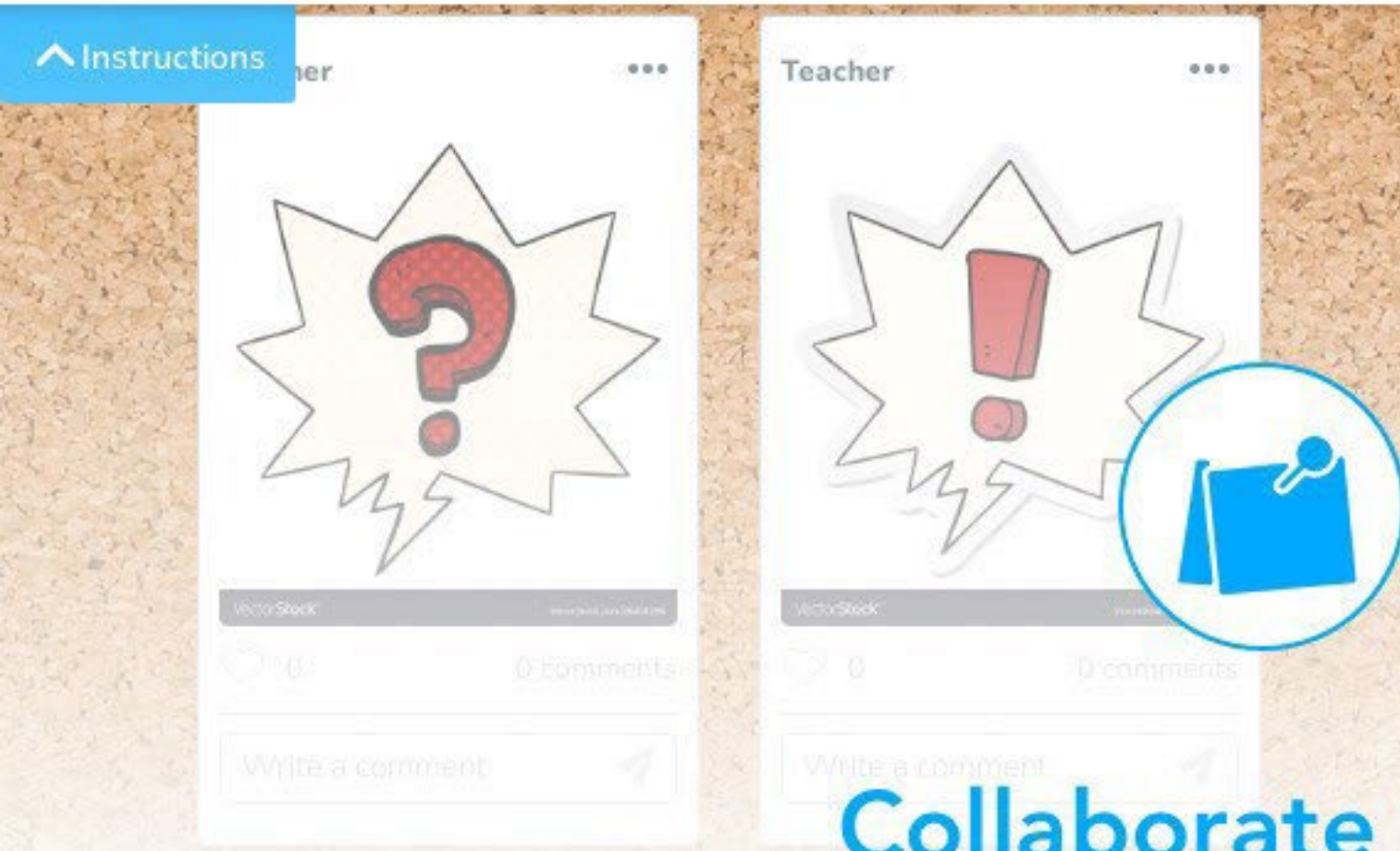
