The Policy states how the LEA includes parents and family members in conducting an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the parent and family engagement policy and identifies: <ul> <li>barriers to engagement of parents, especially parents who are economically disadvantaged, disabled, of limited English or literacy proficiency, or of any racial or ethnic minority;</li> <li>the needs that parents and families have that may prevent them from helping with their children's learning and from engaging with school staff; and</li> <li>strategies to support successful family-school interactions.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		
6. The Policy states how the LEA uses the findings of the annual evaluation to design evidence-based strategies for more effective family engagement and to revise family engagement policies. ESEA Section 1116(a)(2)(E)		
7. The Policy states how the LEA will engage parents in the activities of Title I schools. This may include establishing a LEA parent advisory board to develop, revise, and review the LEA Parent and Family Engagement Policy. Advisory board membership must adequately represent, in numbers and groups, the population of students served by the LEA. ESEA Section 1116(a)(2)(F)
