

### According to the Flamboyan Foundation, there are five roles' families play in helping to accelerate student learning.






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

Goal 1: Intentionally build and sustain relationships with all families


Goal 2: Build reciprocal and balanced communication with families

**Goal 3:** Collaborate with families to create and/or promote connections among families





### Strengthening Partnerships Framework Guiding Principle 3



**Building a respectful,** trusting, and reciprocal relationship is the shared responsibility of families, practitioners, organizations, and systems. This positive relationship has the individual family's strengths and assets at its center.

  - Gain insight into family strengths to build on




## Home Visits 101


- Visits last 30 minutes and are voluntary for everyone (teachers and families).
- Educators are trained and compensated.
- Educators go out in pairs.
- All students (or a cross section of students) are visited (no negative targeting).
- Visits focus on shared vision and values for success of students.

## Home Visits 101


- 1. Pre- Visit
  - a. Coordinate with the family the best day and time to meet.
  - b. Verify the address with the family. If they ask to meet somewhere that is not their residence, that is okay.
  - c. Confirm who your partner teacher will be.
  - d. Confirm the visit with the family the day prior to the visit.
- 2. During
  - a. Gifts: If it is anything of high-value, \$5 or more then you can politely decline.
  - b. Food: Accept when possible and appropriate.
  - c. Keep the visit positive.
- 3. Post
  - a. Let your supervisor know when you have left.
  - b. Document the visit with notes, photo of the visit, and tracker completion.

- Tell me a little about your child what do they like or dislike?
- As your child's new teacher, what should I know about them?
- What are some things you can share about the best way to teach/motivate/inspire your child?
- What are your hopes and dreams for your child both for the upcoming school year and beyond?
- As your child's teacher, what are your expectations of me?
- What's the best way to communicate with you?



# What is a FAMbassador?

- Get your school excited about this project.

- Make sure that everyone on staff/faculty can explain the purpose of the home visits.

Duties

- Present celebrations and guidance at school/team meetings
- Assist with the buy-in of everyone at the school

Expectations

- Attend required trainings
- Complete documentation
