USBE Background

Family Engagement is a *full, equal, and equitable partnership* among families, educators and community partners to promote children's learning and development from birth through college and career.

Family Engagement should be relational, should build capacity of families and staff, and be linked to learning.

SB 184 requires USBE and a provider to create a pilot complementary approach to school improvement that draws on community resources and engagement.





Why family and community engagement is important

Schools that have equal partnerships with families are more likely to:

- Sustain improvement efforts
- Improve student attendance
- Decrease disciplinary issues
- Develop positive school climate and culture
- Improve teacher satisfaction & reduce turnover

When **families** are equipped to engage with learning, their **children** are more likely to:

- Improve their grades
- Attend school more regularly
- Enroll in higher-level programs and graduate
- Have fewer discipline issues in/out of class
- Be more positive about school and learning

Share your thinking

Perception: 90% of parents, regardless of race, income, and education level, believe their child is at or above grade level in reading and math.

Reality: Only about 40% of students perform at grade level or higher.



Goals of the pilot initiative

Equip and inform families to help their children thrive in secondary school

Build stronger connections between families, educators, and community partners

Develop successful student transitions in the middle school years

Build partnership capacity across the school community

Phase 1 – Building Readiness

Phase 1 – Building Readiness (February – June 2022)

Assemble school FACE improvement teams	Schools	March-June 2022

Data collection and analysis	UEPC	Ongoing



Phase 2 – Implementation (June 2022 – June 2023)

Initial professional learning event with each school (importance of FACE)	WestEd	Summer 2022
Planning	WestEd, schools, FACE teams	Ongoing
Family & Community Learning Events (3)	Schools, FACE teams	August 2022-May 2023
Event reflection meetings (after each event)	WestEd, schools, FACE teams	August 2022-May 2023
Data collection and analysis	UEPC, schools	Ongoing
Final implementation/evaluation report	UEPC	Summer 2023
