- The Power of Literacy: I encourage you to listen to this podcast episode featuring Hilderbrand Pelzer III. They discuss their work in juvenile detention centers and I encourage you to consider how literacy serves as a protective factor for our students. I also encourage you to brainstorm how we as educators can strengthen our practices to ensure our students are able to grow their literacy skills. Utah passed SB 127 and has committed to a 70% rate of K-3 students reading at grade level by the end of third grade by the year 2027. Stay tuned to learn about what supports the USBE is putting in place to help LEAs reach this goal.



### What is the Indicator 8 Survey?

The USBE administers the Indicator 8 survey yearly to larger LEAs and every other year to smaller LEAs. The Indicator 8 survey is specific to families whose children receive special education services and seeks to measure the percentage of parents who report that the school facilitated parent involvement in the process of providing services to their students. Questions on the survey ask about relationships families have with staff, ease of communication and involvement, and communication. **Answer these three quick questions about indicator 8!**

# **Promising Practices:**West Ed Partnership for Middle School Success


The USBE has been working with West Ed and the Utah Education Policy Center on a pilot program aimed at increasing student success, advancing school improvement efforts, and strengthening community partnerships. The long-term objective of this work is to learn and create an evidence-based middle school family and community engagement model that is replicable, scalable, and sustainable for middle schools throughout the state of Utah.

### **Key Takeaways from the Partnership**

- Prioritize family engagement: FACE Teams and Specialists help to ensure that family engagement is embedded systemically throughout the day-to-day operation of your LEA.
- **Be intentional:** Ensure that your communication is specific, explicit, concise, and accessible to your families.
- Don't reinvent the wheel: Modify existing events with interest, attendance, and positive feedback from parents. Reshape what you are already doing to center families.
