Indicator 8 Reports are Ready!

If your LEA participated in the 2022-2023 Indicator 8 survey cycle, your reports are ready for download and review in UPIPS.

LEAS should be aware of their report results. These results should be discussed and reviewed by the Special Education Director, Special Education Teachers, and paraprofessionals

As a state, there is so much we can learn from the Indicator 8 survey. State trends indicated:

Parents want a higher frequency of communication and more personalized communication as highlighted by the state response of an overall 73.8%

supporting students who receive special education services. Additionally, general education teachers and additional administrators should also provide input on how the report can inform the ways the LEA is supporting students receiving special education services and their families. Local review can help to identify future goals, shifts in strategies, and areas to focus on as LEAs develop their school improvement plans for the following year.

positive response rate for the communication scale (a 4 to 9 point difference when compared to the other three scales).

Specific recommendations:

- Follow up from teachers and/or administrators for parental questions or concerns.
- Be explicit in your feedback or examples of ways parental input is incorporated into a student's school day.
- Schedule times to do individual check-ins with families via their preferred method of contact (ask families what method of contact best meets their needs).
- Provide specific updates related to a student's goals and also personal observations.
