SB 127 Community Engagement and Science of Reading



We invite you to participate in an upcoming information session to learn more about a special project with the USBE in partnership with MGT of America. This project focuses on engaging families and communities to ensure at least 70% of Utah's 3rd-grade students are reading at grade level by 2027. LEAs will participate in two-year cohorts beginning as early as January of 2024.

Program Highlights:

- Create a data-driven roadmap specific to your school to engage families and communities effectively in literacy development.
- Expand your skill set via three high-impact professional learning sessions designed to equip school-based community coordinators with the knowledge, skills, and

- resources to effectively engage families and school communities in literacy development efforts.
- Engage in Communities of Practice, small groups that bring participants together to share common goals and strategies, with other leaders across the state.
- Consult with community engagement and Science of Reading experts on your school's roadmap and identify the next steps to support and engage your school community.
- Learn how to implement regional literacy events that empower your school community.
- Elevate your school's literacy and engagement with a multitude of collaborative resources and toolkits.

Involve Parents in Modeling Healthy Coping Skills

In case you missed the July 2023 Special Educator newsletter, parents and families can help in building students coping skills. Highlights on how to involve parents and families:


- Attend parent group meetings. This can also include helping to plan
 parent workshops. As professionals, we have great ideas on what our
 families currently need but asking families what they need is a keyway
 to improve participation with attendance as well as engagement! A
 quick pulse check of parent needs can be done at already scheduled
 events like APTT night, Parent Teacher Conferences, and even pick-up.
- Support parent's skill development! This can mean utilizing a
 curriculum like the <u>Be Strong Families</u> (not a USBE endorsement) to
 help parents identify topics of concern and practice how to engage in
 difficult conversations with their students. You can also consider

hosting workshops for parents to build their own skills around general interpersonal communication or coping skills. Increase their skills and awareness so that they can model healthier strategies to deal with stress or conflict for their students.
