713 courses offered in existing high schools, and partnering higher education institutions;

714 \_\_\_\_\_ (e) centralize high-cost programs in the school district technical center;

715 \_\_\_\_\_ (f) conduct approved programs in a minimum of five CTE career cluster areas;

716 \_\_\_\_\_ (g) conduct a minimum of 15 different state approved CTE concentrator and  
717 completer courses; and

718 \_\_\_\_\_ (h) submit verification of all requirements stated in this section annually [or as](#)  
719 requested to the Superintendent.

720 \_\_\_\_\_ (3) A district that serves 18,000 students or more in grades 9-12 may qualify



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721 for up to two district technical center locations through an application process prescribed by the  
722 Superintendent.

723 (4) To qualify for the school district technical center WPU disbursement, a  
724 district serving rural and necessarily existent small schools, as described in Section [53F-2-304](#)  
725 shall:

726 (a) provide at least one facility other than an existing high school as a  
727 designated school district technical center;

728 (b) employ a full-time CTE administrator for the center in addition to the district  
729 CTE director;

730 (c) enroll a minimum of 300 students in the school district technical center  
731 courses;

732 (d) prevent unwarranted duplication by the school district technical center of  
733 courses offered in existing high schools, and partnering higher education institutions;

734 (e) centralize high-cost programs in the school district technical center;

735 (f) conduct approved programs in a minimum of four CTE career cluster  
736 areas;

737 (g) conduct a minimum of 12 different state approved CTE concentrator and  
738 completer courses; and

739 (h) submit verification of all requirements stated in this section annually [and as](#)  
740 [requested](#) to the Superintendent.

741

742 **R277-911-8. Disbursement of Funds – Skill Certification.**

743 (1) Pursuant to Subsection [53F-2-311\(2\)\(c\)](#), an LEA may receive additional  
744 disbursement for competency attainment of student achievement on approved program  
745 certifications.

746 (2) To be eligible for skill certification compensation, an approved LEA shall  
747 demonstrate the LEA's students have demonstrated mastery of established standards for the  
748 CTE program.

749 (3) The LEA shall demonstrate the mastery through an authorized test  
750 administrator that shall follow test administration and ethics requirements identified in Rule

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751 R277-404.

752 (4) An LEA shall keep records of the certification and skill verification tests or  
753 processes used to demonstrate mastery as described in Subsection (3) for monitoring and auditing  
754 purposes.

755 (5) The Superintendent shall distribute funds to an LEA by the following formula:

756 (a) an amount determined by using a count of total points of skill certification  
757 weight points determined by the Superintendent from a student’s skill certification earned by June  
758 15 annually; and

759 (b) a proportionate amount of the available funding based on the LEA’s number of  
760 skill certification points earned proportionate to the total number of skill certification points  
761 earned statewide for the prior year.

762

763 **R277-911-9. Disbursement of Funds – CTE Leadership Organization Funds.**

764 (1) Pursuant to Subsection 53F-2-311(2)(d), an LEA may receive an additional  
765 disbursement for student participation costs in approved student leadership organizations also  
766 known as Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSO) as described in Subsection (4).

767 (2) The Superintendent shall distribute funds to an LEA with:

768 (a) an approved CTE program; and

769 (b) evidence of student participation in CTSOs with related expenses.

770 (3) The Superintendent shall distribute funds to an LEA that meets the criteria  
771 listed in Subsection (2) using the following formula:

772 (a) an amount using a count of the LEA’s total CTSO student members by March  
773 15 annually; and

774 (b) a proportionate amount of the available funding based on the LEA’s number  
775 of CTSO members proportionate to the total number of student members in the state for the  
776 prior year.

777 (4) An LEA shall use the student leadership disbursement for qualifying CTE  
778 leadership organizations that are nationally and state chartered by March 15 annually and  
779 include:

780 (a) SkillsUSA;

782 \_\_\_\_\_ (c) FFA;  
783 \_\_\_\_\_ (d) HOSA - Future Health Professionals;

786 \_\_\_\_\_ (g) TSA (Technology Student Association); and  
787 \_\_\_\_\_ (h) Other organizations that may be approved by the Superintendent that meet  
788 qualifications identified in Subsection [R277-914-2\(3\)](#).  
789 \_\_\_\_\_ (5) An LEA shall use the funds disbursed under this section only for the LEA's  
790 CTE leadership organization expenses.

791

792 **R277-911-10. Disbursement of Funds – Summer CTE Agriculture Programs.**

- 793 \_\_\_\_\_ (1) Pursuant to Subsection [53F-2-311\(3\)\(d\)](#), an LEA shall receive a 5 WPU  
794 disbursement for a qualifying summer CTE agriculture program as described in this section.

796 using a form and timeline specified by the Superintendent each year.  
797 \_\_\_\_\_ (3) If approved, the LEA shall:

799 program:  
800 \_\_\_\_\_ (i) holds a valid Utah teaching license, with an endorsement in agriculture, as  
801 outlined in Subsection [R277-911-3\(5\)\(d\)\(v\)](#);  
802 \_\_\_\_\_ (ii) has developed a calendar of activities which shall be approved by the LEA's  
803 administration and reviewed by the Superintendent;  
804 \_\_\_\_\_ (iii) has or will work a minimum of 360 hours in the summer CTE agriculture  
805 program;  
806 \_\_\_\_\_ (iv) has or will not engage in other employment, including self-employment,  
807 which conflicts with the teacher's performance in the summer CTE agriculture program;  
808 \_\_\_\_\_ (v) has developed and filed a weekly schedule and a monthly report outlining  
809 accomplishments related to the calendar of activities with:  
810 \_\_\_\_\_ (A) the school principal;

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- 811 \_\_\_\_\_ (B) the LEA CTE director; and
- 812 \_\_\_\_\_ (C) the Superintendent; and
- 813 \_\_\_\_\_ (vi) has a minimum of 35 students enrolled in the summer CTE agriculture  
814 program; and
- 815 \_\_\_\_\_ (vii) visits the participating students a minimum of two times during the summer  
816 program with a minimum average of four on-site visits to students; and
- 817 \_\_\_\_\_ (b) provides evidence or assures that a student enrolled in the summer CTE  
818 agriculture program:
- 819 \_\_\_\_\_ (i) has on file in the LEA office the student's Plan for College and Career  
820 Readiness goal related to agriculture;
- 821 \_\_\_\_\_ (ii) in conjunction with the student's parent or employer and the teacher, has a  
822 developed individualized plan of activities, including a supervised occupational experience  
823 program;
- 824 \_\_\_\_\_ (iii) has completed the eighth grade; and
- 825 \_\_\_\_\_ (iv) has not graduated from high school.
- 826 \_\_\_\_\_ (4) A college intern may be approved to be the instructor of a summer CTE  
827 agriculture program upon approval by the Superintendent.
- 828 \_\_\_\_\_ (5) To be approved as an instructor, the LEA shall provide evidence or assure that  
829 the college intern shall:
- 830 \_\_\_\_\_ (a) be enrolled in an approved postsecondary Agricultural Education-Teacher  
831 Preparation program, minimally at the junior or senior level;
- 832 \_\_\_\_\_ (b) under the guidance of the supervising teacher, develop a calendar of  
833 activities which shall be approved by LEA administration and reviewed by the Superintendent;
- 834 \_\_\_\_\_ (c) work a minimum of 360 hours in the CTE summer agriculture program;
- 835 \_\_\_\_\_ (d) not engage in other employment, including self-employment, which conflicts  
836 with the intern's performance in the CTE summer agriculture program;
- 837 \_\_\_\_\_ (e) under the guidance of the supervising teacher, develop and file a weekly  
838 schedule and a monthly report outlining accomplishments related to the calendar of activities  
839 with:
- 840 \_\_\_\_\_ (i) the school principal;

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- 841 \_\_\_\_\_ (ii) the LEA CTE director; and  
842 \_\_\_\_\_ (iii) the Superintendent; and  
843 \_\_\_\_\_ (g) enroll a minimum of 20 students in the summer CTE agriculture program;  
844 and  
845 \_\_\_\_\_ (h) visit the participating students a minimum of two times during the summer  
846 program with a minimum average of four on-site visits to students.  
847 \_\_\_\_\_ (6) The Superintendent shall collect data from the program and staff of each  
848 LEA to ensure compliance with approved standards.  
849 \_\_\_\_\_ (7) An LEA shall submit to the Superintendent a final program report through  
850 the funding application due August 31 annually.  
851 \_\_\_\_\_ (8) The Superintendent shall allocate Summer CTE agricultural funding to each  
852 LEA conducting an approved program for no more than 360 hours and 35 students.  
853 \_\_\_\_\_ (9) An LEA operating a program with a supervising teacher and college intern  
854 shall receive a combined total of seven WPUs of the summer CTE agricultural allocation.

856 **R277-911-11. Disbursement of Funds – School Counseling, College and Career**  
857 **Awareness, and Work-Based Learning Programs.**

- 858 \_\_\_\_\_ (1) Pursuant to Subsection [53F-2-311\(2\)\(b\)\(ii\)](#), the Superintendent shall  
859 distribute funds to an LEA as described by each respective provision listed in Subsection  
860 (2).  
861 \_\_\_\_\_ (2) An LEA shall use the distributed funds for school counseling consistent with  
862 Subsection [53E-2-304\(2\)\(b\)](#) and Rule [R277-462](#).  
863 \_\_\_\_\_ (3) An LEA may use funds distributed under this section for:  
864 \_\_\_\_\_ (a) work-based learning programs consistent with Rule [R277-915](#); and  
865 \_\_\_\_\_ (b) Career Awareness programs consistent with Rule [R277-916](#).

866

867 **R277-911-12. Disbursement of Funds – Added Cost Funds.**

- 868 \_\_\_\_\_ (1) Subject to remaining funds and pursuant to [53F-2-311\(4\)](#), an LEA may receive  
869 an additional distribution for added costs of a CTE program after all other distributions have been

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870 allocated pursuant to [53F-2-311\(2\) and \(3\)](#) as further described in this rule.

871 (2) An LEA's added cost distribution shall be a proportionate amount of the remaining  
872 funds calculated by:

873 (a) using the LEA's grades 9 through 12 aggregate membership in approved CTE  
874 programs from the previous school year to calculate a CTE average daily membership (ADM);  
875 and

876 (b) determining the LEA's proportionate amount of CTE ADM compared to the  
877 statewide CTE ADM.

878 (3) An LEA may not utilize the following for purposes of generating CTE ADM:

879 (a) travel time, [except as described in R277-419-8\(9\)\(b\)](#);

880 (b) a student who has yet to attend an approved CTE course;

881 (c) a student who has been absent, without excuse, for the previous 10 days;

882 and

883 (d) for student enrollment in courses taken outside of the regular school day or  
884 school year.

885 (4) Except as provided for in Rules [R277-462](#), [R277-915](#), and [R277-916](#), an  
886 LEA that experiences CTE membership growth of 1-10% from the LEA's previous CTE ADM shall  
887 qualify for a growth factor equivalent to the growth percentage to be applied to the LEA's added  
888 cost distribution amount described in Subsection (2).

889 (5) An LEA that receives an added cost distribution shall maintain records to  
890 accurately demonstrate:

891 (a) the entry and exit date of each student; and

892 (b) whether a student has been absent from a CTE course 10 consecutive days.

893 (6) An LEA shall maintain electronic records, including data system records, for  
894 each CTE program which shall include:

895 (a) LEA name;

896 (b) school name;

897 (c) teacher of each CTE course;

898 (d) each CTE course name;

899 (e) each CTE course core code;

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- 900 \_\_\_\_\_ (f) each CTE course section;  
901 \_\_\_\_\_ (g) semester each CTE course is offered;  
902 \_\_\_\_\_ (h) period the student had each CTE course;  
903 \_\_\_\_\_ (i) student membership;  
904 \_\_\_\_\_ (j) total enrollments; and  
905 \_\_\_\_\_ (k) total membership.  
906 \_\_\_\_\_ (7) An LEA that receives an added cost distribution shall only use the funds for  
907 the following expenditures:  
908 \_\_\_\_\_ (a) instructional and program materials and supplies;  
909 \_\_\_\_\_ (b) equipment necessary to the program above and beyond equipment provided  
910 to non-CTE classrooms;  
911 \_\_\_\_\_ (c) CTE Instructor salaries;  
912 \_\_\_\_\_ (d) contracted services for equipment service and specialized program needs;  
913 and  
914 \_\_\_\_\_ (e) professional expenses for CTE-related professional learning, professional  
915 organizations, and CTSOs.  
916 \_\_\_\_\_ (8) Programs and courses provided through technical colleges and degree  
917 granting institutions may not qualify for an added cost distribution unless approved by the  
918 Superintendent.

920 **R277-911-13. Corrective Action**

921 \_\_\_\_\_ An LEA that does not comply with the requirements of this rule R277-911,  
922 including not providing MOE of CTE programs, may be subject to a corrective action plan and  
923 potential reduction of funds or penalty in accordance with Section [R277-114](#).
