

1 **R277. Education, Administration.**

2 **R277-473. Utah Computer Science Grant.**

3 **R277-473-1. Authority and Purpose.**

4 (1) This rule is authorized by:

5 (a) Utah Constitution Article X, Section 3, which vests general control and
6 supervision over public education in the Board;

7 (b) Subsection 53E-3-401(4), which allows the Board to make rules to execute
8 the Board's duties and responsibilities under the Utah Constitution and state law; and

9 (c) Subsection 63N-12-506(5) which allows the Board, in consultation with the
10 Talent Ready Utah Board, to make rules outlining a grant recipient's reporting
11 requirements; and

12 (d) Subsection 63N-12-506(7) which allows the Board to make rules outlining
13 additional requirements for a grant recipient to include in the grant recipient's computer
14 science grant plan.

15 (2) The purpose of this rule is to outline:

16 (a) the reporting requirements for a grant recipient; and

17 (b) the additional criteria required for a grant recipient to include in the grant
18 recipient's computer science grant plan.

19 **R277-473-2. Definitions.**

20 (1) "Computer science advisory committee" or "advisory committee" means the
21 computer science advisory committee established in Section R277-473-5.

22 (2) "Talent Ready Board" means the same as the term is defined in Subsection
23 63N-12-503

24 **R277-473-3. Incorporation of Utah's Master Plan.**

25 (1) This rule incorporates by reference the Utah Master Plan, August 2019, which

30 **R277-473-4. LEA Planning Grants.**

31 (1) An LEA may apply for a planning grant in preparation for a full LEA plan and
32 receiving a Computer Science Initiative Grant as described in this rule.

33 (2) A planning grant awarded under Subsection (1) shall be in the amount
34 determined by student enrollment within the USBE state tier system up to \$30,000.

35 (3) In order to qualify for a planning grant, an LEA shall:

36 (a) send an LEA representative to a pre-grant submission training conducted by
37 the Superintendent; and

38 (b) complete a readiness assessment created by the Superintendent that
39 provides an analysis for existing K-12 computer infrastructure in preparation for a grant.

40 (4)(a) If an LEA receives a planning grant, the LEA shall submit an LEA plan as
41 set forth in Section R277-473-7 and 8 for the subsequent school year.

42 (b) An LEA that fails to submit an LEA plan in the subsequent year shall
43 reimburse funds awarded under Subsection (2).

45 **R277-473-5 Computer Science Advisory Committee Duties.**

46 (1) The Superintendent shall create a computer science advisory committee.

47 (2) The advisory committee shall include the following members as non-voting
48 chairs:

49 (a) the Superintendent ~~or designee~~; and

50 (b) the Executive Director of the Governor's Office of Economic Development or
51 designee.

52 (3) In addition to the chairs described in Subsection (1), the Board, in
53 consultation with the Talent Ready Utah Board, shall appoint five members to the
54 advisory committee as follows:

55 (a) an industry representative;

56 (b) one member who represents a school district with expertise in digital teaching
57 and learning;

58 (c) one member who represents a charter school with expertise in digital teaching
59 and learning;

60 (d) a member of higher education; and

61 (e) a non-profit national computer science organization representative.

62 (3) The advisory committee shall:

63 (a) oversee review of an LEA plan to determine whether the LEA plan meets the
64 criteria described in Subsection 63N-12-506(7);

65 (b) make a recommendation to the Superintendent and the Board on whether the
66 Board should approve or deny an LEA plan;

67 (c) make recommendations to an LEA on how the LEA may improve the LEA's
68 plan; and

69 (d) perform other duties as directed by:

70 (i) the Board; or

71 (ii) the Superintendent.

72 (4) The advisory committee may select additional LEA plan reviewers to assist
73 the advisory committee with the work described in Subsection (3).

74 (5) The advisory committee, or the Superintendent on behalf of the advisory
75 committee, shall present the advisory committee's recommendations on whether to
76 approve or deny each LEA plan to the Board for the Board's approval.

78 **R277-473-6 Board Approval or Denial of an LEA's Plan.**

79 (1) The Board shall approve or deny each LEA plan submitted by the advisory
80 committee ~~to the Board~~.

81 (2) If the Board denies an LEA's plan, the LEA may amend and re-submit the
82 LEA's plan to the advisory committee until the Board approves the LEA plan.

83 (3) The Board shall submit an approved LEA plan to the Talent Ready Utah
84 Board for final approval as described in Subsection 63N-12-506(4).

86 **R277-473-7 LEA Plan Requirements.**

87 (1) An LEA shall develop a four-year ~~LEA~~ plan in cooperation with educators,

88 paraeducators, and parents.

89 (2) A plan shall be consistent with Subsection 63N-12-506(7) and include a
90 comprehensive model outlined for each grade level ~~[within the LEA].~~

91

92 **R277-473-8 Grant Distribution.**

93 (1) If an LEA's plan is approved by the Board, the Superintendent shall distribute
94 grant money to the participating LEA as described in this section.

95 ~~[(2) The Superintendent may not distribute more than 10% of the total legislative~~
96 ~~allocation on planning grants as described in Subsection R277-473-4.]~~

97 (2) An LEA with an approved plan may receive up to the LEA's requested
98 amount.

99 (3) The Superintendent and advisory committee shall make computer science
100 grant amount recommendations to the Board ~~[on a competitive basis].~~

101 (4) The computer science grant amount recommendations shall be based on:

102 (a) an LEA's ability to satisfy the requirements of Subsection 63N-12-506(7);

103 (b) an LEA's completion of all the requirements listed in Subsection R277-473-4;

104 (c) the quality of an LEA's plan;

105 (d) the feasibility of an LEA's plan implementation; and

106 (e) the ability of an LEA to maximize the grant amount to reach the greatest
107 amount of students possible.

108 (5)(a) If an LEA's plan is not approved during year one of the program, the
109 advisory committee and the Superintendent shall provide additional supports to help the
110 LEA become a qualifying LEA.

111 (b) The Superintendent shall redistribute the funds an LEA would have been
112 eligible to receive, in accordance with the competitive awards, to other qualifying LEAs if
113 the LEA's plan is not approved after additional support described in Subsection (6)(a) is
114 given.

115 (6) A non-qualifying LEA may reapply for grant money in subsequent years
116 based on the LEA's plan being approved by the Board.

117

118 **R277-473-9. Prohibited Uses of Grant Money.**

119 A participating LEA may not use the grant money:

120 (1) to fund non-computer science programs;

121 (2) to purchase mobile telephones;

122 (3) to fund voice or data plans for mobile telephones;

123 (4) to supplant local funds; or

124 (5) for any expenditure outside of an LEA's budget for the LEA's approved plan.

126 **R277-473-11. Participating LEA Reporting Requirements.**

127 (1) An LEA shall provide a report as described in [Subsections](#) 63N-12-
128 506(8)(a),(b), and (c).
