- Possible Methodologies for Calculating Equitable Share
 - a) Total enrollment in LEA and participating non-public schools
 - b) Proportional share of FY 2019-2020 Title I, Part A funds
 - c) Number of students, ages 5 through 17, from low-income families in Title I schools and participating non-public schools
- LEA Reported Expenditures for Equitable Services for 90% ESSER*
 - Of those funds, total amount expended by the LEA on Public Schools
 - Of those funds, total amount expended by the LEA on equitable services for Non-public School students and teachers
- LEA Reported Expenditure of Funds for Equitable Services for GEER
 - Of those funds, total amount expended by the LEA on Public Schools
 - Of those funds, total amount expended by the LEA on equitable services for Non-public School students and teachers

*Initially, LEAs were instructed to follow the methodology in Section 1117 of ESEA until the U. S. Department of Education issued an Interim Final Rule

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Positions

- LEA Reporting FTE Positions as of March 13, 2020
- LEA Reporting FTE Positions as of September 30, 2020
 - This may be reporting ALL FTEs
 - This may also be reporting FTE positions created or retained as a result of ESSER funds and FTE positions created or retained as a result of GEER funds (as two separate data sets).

USBE is seeking clarification and has submitted public comment related to this request.

Legislative Data Requests for CARES

PPE Procurement in K-12

- LEA Reporting: Did an LEA use CARES funding for procurement of PPE? (Y/N) *(This would be LEA procurement of additional items beyond the state distribution.)*
 - If yes, an LEA will need to report the categories of PPE that was procured using CARES funding (Y/N)
 - Masks for Teachers
 - Masks for Students
 - Face Shields (?)
 - Non-contact thermometers
 - Hand Sanitizer Stands
 - Plexiglass barriers
 - Desk dividers
 - Cleaning supplies (disinfectant wipes, etc.)
 - Other (specify)

Training for Teachers

- LEA Reporting: Did an LEA use CARES funding for training teachers in needs related to COVID-19? (Y/N)
 - If yes, an LEA will need to report the amount of total CARES funding that was used to train teachers.

Infrastructure for Remote/Blended Learning

- LEA Reporting: Did an LEA use CARES funding for infrastructure related to providing remote or blended learning opportunities? (Y/N)
 - If yes, an LEA will need to report the methods implemented for elementary and secondary grade levels (Y/N)
 - Classroom cameras
 - Microphones or other Audio Enhancement Tools
 - Devices for Teachers
 - Broadband for Teachers
 - Broadband for Students
 - Other (specify)

OPTIONAL: Narrative for State

- LEA Reporting: Each LEA will have the opportunity to provide a narrative related to their implementation of CARES funding for state consideration. This is optional, but allows LEAs to provide feedback. Examples could include innovative use of CARES funding, etc.
