2	R277-489. Kindergarten [Entry and Exit] Programs and Assessment [-Enhanced
3	Kindergarten Program].
4	R277-489-1. Authority and Purpose.
5	(1) This rule is authorized by:
6	(a) Utah Constitution Article X, Section 3, which vests general control and
7	supervision over public education in the Board;
8	(b) Subsection 53E-3-401(4), which permits the Board to make rules to execute
9	the Board's duties and responsibilities under the Utah constitution and state law; and
10	(c) Section <u>53F-2-507</u> , which directs the Board to distribute funds appropriated for
11	[the enhanced kindergarten program] OEK and FDK to LEAs that apply for the funds.
12	(2) The purpose of this rule is to:
13	(a) require LEAs to administer a kindergarten entry and exit assessment; and
14	(b) establish criteria and procedures to administer the optional enhanced
15	kindergarten program <u>and full-day kindergarten</u> .
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17	R277-489-2. Definitions.
18	[(1) "Enhanced Kindergarten Program" means a program that provides additional
19	instruction to kindergarten age students.]
20	[(2) "Enrollment" means class enrollment of not more than the student enrollment-
21	of other kindergarten classes within the school.]
22	(1) "Efforts to expand FDK statewide" means an LEA's readiness to expand to
23	additional FDK classrooms.
24	(2) "FDK" or "full-day kindergarten" means a kindergarten day where the schedule
25	is equivalent in length to grades 1 through 3.
26	(3) "Geography" means the classification of the county in which the LEA is located,
27	with priority to counties in this order:

28	(a) sixth class county;
29	(b) fifth class county;
30	(c) fourth class county;
31	(d) third class county;
32	(e) second class county; and
33	(f) first class county.
34	(4) "LEA's receipt of ongoing federal funding" means the amount of ongoing Title I
35	funding used by an LEA to fund FDK.
36	[(3) "Optional Enhanced Kindergarten plan" or "LEA plan" means the enhanced
37	kindergarten program plan submitted by an LEA and approved and accepted for funding-
38	by the Superintendent.
39	(4) "Kindergarten System of Support" means interventions to improve kindergarten
40	literacy outcomes, numeracy outcomes, or both.]
41	(5) "Optional enhanced kindergarten program" or "OEK" means a program that
1 2	provides additional instruction to kindergarten age students.
43	(6) "Socioeconomic need" means an LEA's percentage of students eligible for free
14	and reduced lunch, with priority to an LEA with a greater percentage of eligible students.
45	([5] <u>7</u>) "Utah eTranscript and Record Exchange" or "UTREx" means a system that
46	allows individual detailed student records to be exchanged electronically between public
1 7	education LEAs and the Board, and allows electronic transcripts to be sent to any post-
18	secondary institution, private or public, in-state or out-of-state, that participates in the e-
19	transcript service.
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51	R277-489-3. Administration of Kindergarten Entry and Exit Assessments.
52	(1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), an LEA shall administer:
53	(a) a kindergarten entry assessment, approved by the Superintendent, to each
54	kindergarten student sometime during the three weeks before through the three weeks
55	after the first day of kindergarten; and
56	(b) a kindergarten exit assessment, approved by the Superintendent, to each
57	kindergarten student sometime during the four weeks before the last day of school.
58	(2) An I FA (that does not participate in the enhanced kindergarten program or the

59	Early Interactive Reading Software Program described in Rule R277-496] is not required
60	to administer the kindergarten entry and exit assessments if the LEA does not participate
61	<u>in:[-]</u>
62	(a) the optional enhanced kindergarten program;
63	(b) full-day kindergarten; or
64	(c) the Early Interactive Reading Software Program described in Rule R277-496.
65	(3) The days used for the assessment shall be consistent with Subsection R277-
66	<u>419</u> -5(6)(d).
67	(4) An LEA shall submit to the Data Gateway:
68	(a) kindergarten entry assessment data by September 30; and
69	(b) kindergarten exit assessment data by June 15.
70	(5) In accordance with Section R277-114, the Superintendent may recommend
71	action to the Board, including withholding of funds, if an LEA fails to provide complete,
72	accurate, and timely reporting under Subsection (4).
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74	R277-489-4. Use of Kindergarten Entry and Exit Assessment Data.
75	(1) The Superintendent or an LEA may use entry and exit assessment data
76	obtained in accordance with Section R277-489-3 to:
77	(a) provide insights into current levels of academic performance upon entry and
78	exit of kindergarten;
79	(b) identify students in need of early intervention instruction and promote
80	differentiated instruction for all students;
81	(c) understand the effectiveness of programs, such as extended-day kindergarten
82	and preschool;
83	(d) provide opportunities for data-informed decision making and cost-benefit
84	analysis of early learning initiatives;
85	(e) identify effective instructional practices or strategies for improving student
86	achievement outcomes in a targeted manner; and
87	(f) understand the influence and impact of full-day kindergarten on at-risk students
88	in both the short- and long-term.
89	(2) An LEA may not use entry and exit assessment data obtained in accordance

90	with Section R277-489-3 to:
91	(a) justify early enrollment of a student who is not currently eligible to enroll in
92	kindergarten, such as a student with a birthday falling after September 1;
93	(b) evaluate an educator's teaching performance; or
94	(c) determine whether a student should be retained or promoted between grades
95	
96	R277-489-5. Optional Enhanced Kindergarten Program.
97	(1) The Superintendent shall accept applications from LEAs for [enhanced-
98	kindergarten] OEK programs that satisfy the requirements of Section 53F-2-507, and the
99	provisions of this rule.
100	(2) The Superintendent shall establish timelines for submission of applications.
101	(3) An LEA application for the optional enhanced kindergarten program funds
102	shall include:
103	(a) the names of schools for which program funds shall be used;
104	(b) a description of the delivery methods that may be used to serve eligible
105	students, such as:
106	(i) full-day kindergarten;
107	(ii) additional hours; or
108	(iii) other means.
109	(c) a description of the evidence-based early intervention model used by the LEA
110	(d) a description of how the program focuses on age-appropriate literacy and
111	numeracy skills;
112	(e) a description of how the program targets at-risk students; and
113	(f) other information as requested by the Superintendent.
114	(4) An LEA shall submit the appropriate kindergarten UTREx code to the
115	Superintendent through UTREx by June 15 annually.
116	(5) The Superintendent shall distribute funds to eligible charter schools based on
117	a formula identifying the percentage of students in public schools and the percentage of
118	students with the greatest need for an enhanced kindergarten program consistent with
119	Subsection <u>53F-2-507</u> (4)(a).
120	(6) The Superintendent shall distribute funds to eligible school districts by

121	determining the number of students eligible to receive free lunch in the prior school year
122	for each school district and prorating the remaining funds based on the number of
123	students eligible to receive free lunch in each school district.
124	(7) The Superintendent shall establish timelines for distribution of the optional
125	enhanced kindergarten program funds.
126	[(8) An LEA may not require a student to participate in an enhanced kindergarten
127	program.]
128	[R277-489-6 Eligibility for Enhanced Kindergarten Programs Grant FundsUse of
129	Funds.
130	(1)(a) The Superintendent shall review data gathered from previous year
131	kindergarten entry and exit assessments to determine an LEA's ongoing eligibility for
132	enhanced kindergarten program grant funds.
133	(b) The Superintendent shall calculate individual student performance on the
134	kindergarten entry and exit assessment and then average school-level results to
135	determine whether a particpating school meets the cut score.
136	(2) An eligible LEA shall have 75% of its participating schools achieve a school-
137	level cut score of meets expectations, which includes the school-level average progress-
138	score in literacy and numeracy.
139	(3) If an eligible LEA does not meet performance measures, as defined in
140	Subsection (2), the Superintendent shall require the LEA to participate in the Kindergarten
141	System of Support to improve outcomes.
142	(4) The Superintendent shall establish the strategies, interventions, and
143	techniques for LEAs that are in the Kindergarten System of Support to help schools
144	achieve performance outcomes on the kindergarten entry and exit assessment.]
145	(8) An LEA governing board shall use OEK program money for optional enhanced
146	kindergarten programs and supports that have proven to significantly increase the
147	percentage of students who are proficient in literacy and mathematics, including:
148	(a) salary and benefits for individuals teaching and supporting enhanced
149	kindergarten programs; and
150	(b) evidence-based intervention curriculum.
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R2	77-489-6. Full-Day Kindergarten.
	(1) The Superintendent shall establish deadlines for an LEA to submit an
app	olication for FDK funds.
	(2) An LEA application shall include:
	(a) the amount of Title I funds currently dedicated to fund FDK;
	(b) the number of new FDK classrooms the LEA proposes to fund; and
	(c) other information requested by the Superintendent.
	(3) An LEA shall submit the appropriate kindergarten UTREx code to the
Su	perintendent through UTREx by June 15 annually.
	(4) The Superintendent shall distribute funds appropriated for FDK consistent with
Su	osection 53G-7-203(5), giving priority to LEAs with greatest need in the following order:
	(a) socioeconomic need;
	(b) geography;
	(c) efforts to expand full-day kindergarten; and
	(d) receipt of on-going federal funding.
	(5) If an LEA's current annual combined allocation for kindergarten students
exc	eeds an amount equal to what the LEA would receive if the LEA were funded from the
<u>kin</u>	dergarten basic school program at a full WPU based on the LEA's number of
<u>kin</u>	dergarten students, the LEA may not receive additional FDK funds.
	(6) The Superintendent shall establish timelines for distribution of FDK funds;
	(7) An LEA governing board shall use FDK money to fund salary and benefits of full-
<u>day</u>	v kindergarten teachers.
