Daud Mumin is a student at Copper Hills High School and is a state officer in HOSA. He is also the Social Science Sterling Scholar for Copy Hills High School. While participating in CTE he had the opportunity to listen to guest speakers and participate in hands-on activities such as dissections and suturing. He credits CTE and HOSA for guiding him on his career path. Here is his story.

"In 1996, my mother and father immigrated from the war-torn country of Samalia. Growing up my parents taught me the values of hard work, dedication, and preparation. Going through middle school I didn't know how to pursue my dreams of becoming a cardiothoracic surgeon. When I entered high school plenty of doors opened for me and CTE did just that. HOSA, Future Health Professionals, was an area in which I could succeed and prepare myself for college and pursuing my dream. With speakers and hands-on activities such dissections and suturing, CTE helped me reach a career decision that I thought I would never have. CTE helped me maintain a focus and



understanding of my goals. This had a huge impact on my life and I thank CTE and HOSA every day for the opportunities."

3D Printing Lab at Hillside Middle School


Jeff Streba, a teacher at Hillside Middle School, has been teaching since the year 2000. Prior to teaching he was a project manager in the aerospace industry designing manufacturing processes for jet engine parts. Jeff teaches technical education and has a passion for teaching his students about 3D printing. Here is his story.

"As a CTE teacher at <u>Hillside Middle School</u> in the Salt Lake City School District I have started a 3D printing lab. I currently have eight printers and I am looking for financing for at least six more. Students love 3D printing. There are always more students wanting to print than there are printers. Due to the lack of printers the class is held as an after-school program rather than during normal class times.



"One of the nice things about 3D printing is the students can take it to whatever level of difficulty they want. The most basic level would be to download an already made object from

a website like <u>Thingiverse</u> or <u>YouMagine</u> and print something. Even at this level, middle school students learn about zipped files, the size and scale of objects, bed adhesion, and the basics of 3D printing.



"The next step is to have students design their own object. For this, the students use SketchUp. This works great because in the 7th grade College and Career Awareness class, SketchUp is part of the curriculum in the Information Technology Pathway. In the 8th grade Exploring Technology class, the students build upon the knowledge learned the year earlier. Having a foundation of designing 3 dimensionally prepares middle schoolers for digital media classes in high school. Many students dive into SketchUp by designing their house and printing it. I actually had one student design our school.

"3D printing is an exciting technology to introduce to students. Having one printer is a novelty and students simply watch it work. Having several printers allows the students to learn skills that will carry them to high school and beyond. 3D printing also creates an excitement and frenzy about learning something new, and after all, isn't that what we want?"
