<u>Elementary schools</u> shall conduct emergency drills at least once each month during school time. The **first** fire drill shall be conducted in the first 10 days of the regular school year and one fire drill every other month during the school year. Required emergency fire drills shall be alternated with a security or safety drill -- refer to Utah Code R277-400-6 for specific details and additional information.

<u>Secondary schools</u> shall conduct emergency evacuation drills for fire at least once every two months to a total of four emergency evacuation drills during ninemonth school year. The first emergency evacuation drill for fire shall be conducted within 10 school days after the beginning of classes. The third emergency evacuation drill for fire, weather permitting, shall be conducted 10 school days after the beginning of the next calendar year. The **second** and fourth emergency evacuation drills may be substituted by a security or safety drill to include shelter in place, earthquake drill, or lock down for violence.

Note: Schools that include both elementary and secondary grades in the school shall comply with the elementary emergency drill requirements.

LEA has a policy in place to ensure each school conducts fire and emergency drills as required by Section and Rule.
