Key Components



Virtual trainings

Participate in 5 two-hour sessions with leaders from across the country.



Coaching

Receive differentiated 1-on-1 and small group support from expert leaders and cohort peers.



Collaboration with a team

Apply the learning by building on existing initiatives with a team of staff and families.

Note: Team members also receive some training, but the primary participant is the leader.



National cohort experience

Hear from fellow leaders from around the country, including Institute alumni and family engagement experts.



Artifacts of growth

Capture learning and progress in simple ways throughout the year.

Total time commitment averages 2-4 hours per month from September to April.

4. Apply the leadership moves and best-practices in family engagement that drive school improvement.

- ★ Involves new and/or re-purposed investments
- ★ Applies existing management tools
