Utah 2026 Legislative Session

What Parents Should Know

Each year, Utah's state lawmakers meet during the General Session to review current laws, propose new legislation, and make decisions that affect funding, policies, and programs across the state—including public education. During this 45-day session, legislators introduce and vote on bills that can directly impact students, families, and schools. The information below highlights several proposed bills from the 2026 session that may be especially relevant to parents and caregivers.

Session at a Glance

- January 20, 2026: First day of the annual General Session.
- March 6, 2026: Last day of the annual General Session (45 total days, excluding state and federal holidays)
- May 6, 2026: Normal effective date for bills
