# Attendance Legislation & Commonly Asked Questions



## Attendance Legislation (1)

- What should be included in an attendance policy? (R277-607)
  - Expectations of the school to the student/parent and expectations for the students/parents to the school (all parties are equally responsible and need to be equally invested)
  - Procedures for excusing absences, checking students in/out, etc
  - Interventions for chronic absenteeism/matrix
  - Appeals process
  - Make it easily available to parents, students, and teachers



## Attendance Legislation (2)

- Where in board rule can you find information about the "10-day drop"? (R277-419)
  - (4) (a) For a student primarily enrolled in an attendance validated program, the LEA may not count a student as an eligible student if the eligible student has unexcused absences during the prior ten consecutive school days.



## Attendance Legislation (3)

- (5) Notwithstanding Subsection (4), an LEA:
- (a) shall continue to provide a student with a disability a free and appropriate public education(c) For a student enrolled in a learner validated program, the LEA may not count a student as an eligible student if the LEA has not engaged with the student during the prior ten consecutive school days. even when the student has not attended school or engaged with the LEA during the prior ten consecutive days;

## Attendance Legislation (4)

- (b) shall maintain the student with a disability's enrollment in the LEA; and
- (c) may continue to count the student with a disability in membership for funding purposes up to 30 days if the LEA documents that the LEA is working to locate and engage with the student with a disability.

# Absenteeism Is Rising

Chronic absenteeism in Utah has nearly doubled in 10 years, from 12.2% in 2014 to 23.8% in 2024.



#### Too Sick for School?

A quick guide to help you decide when to keep your child home



Going to school every day helps your child learn and build strong routines. But when kids are sick, it's important they rest and feel better before returning to the classroom.

#### Can My Child Go to School Today?

#### Yes, if they...

- Have a runny nose or light cough with no fever
- Have not had a fever in the last 24 hours and haven't taken medicine
- · Had a stomachache without vomiting
- Have a light rash with no other problems
- Have watery eyes, but are not red, swollen, or painful

#### No, if they...

- Have a fever of 100.4°F (38°C) or higher
- Threw up two or more times in the last 24 hours
- Have watery diarrhea or had an accident, or may be prone to one
- Are too tired or sick to join class or play
- Have red, swollen or painful eyes or they had an eye injury

#### Call the Doctor If Your Child:

- » Has a fever and pain (like earache, sore throat, stomachache, toothache or headache)
- » Has blood in their stool is dehydrated or hasn't peed in 8 hours
- » Has a cough that won't go away or trouble breathing
- » Has eye pain, swelling, or injury
- » Has a rash that is painful, has blisters, or looks like bruises



If you are not sure whether to send your child to school, have specific concerns regarding your child's physical or mental health, or are worried about spreading illness, contact your child's health care provider, urgent care or the school nurse. These tips are not meant to take the place of local health department guidance.

Supports others by sharing tools and pointing them to helpful attendance resources.







#### Family Engagement- What (1)

Family engagement is built by recognizing, respecting and addressing families needs. By doing this, trust is built which will lead to collaboration among all stakeholders (school, family, and community). It is equally important to be culturally aware when engaging with families to better understand cultural differences. The goal is to develop a partnership to improve outcomes for everyone.

## Family Engagement- How

Family engagement is developed by:

- Connecting Early and Often
- Practice Empathy
- Work Together to find solutions
- Communicating in preferred language of each household
- Developing a consistent messaging campaign that is shared out at regular intervals
  - I.e. Every term, monthly, weekly, after breaks, before testing
- Establishing Procedures for Home Visits



# Attendance Interventions focused on Parent Engagement (1)

- Attendance Plans
  - 3 legs (parent, student, school)
  - Build relationships
  - Proactive vs Reactive
  - Set goals together
  - Follow-up



# Attendance Interventions focused on Parent Engagement (2)

- Parent/Teacher Conferences
  - Attendance handouts for teachers to give out
  - Script for teachers to talk about during their conference about school wide attendance goals
  - Attendance meetings with administrators and counselors during parent/teacher conference hours
  - Attendance secretary to be there
