## 2021 Utah Teacher of the Year Finalists Named

SALT LAKE CITY – The Utah State Board of Education today announced the five finalists for 2021 Utah Teacher of the Year. They are:

- John Arthur, a sixth grade teacher at <u>Meadowlark Elementary</u> in the Salt Lake
   City School District.
- Rae Boren, an American Sign Language teacher at <u>Copper Hills High School</u> in the Jordan School District.
- Amy Grgich, a kindergarten teacher at <u>Stansbury Park Elementary</u> in the Tooele
   School District.
- Emma Moss, a Career and Technical Education teacher at <u>Eastmont Middle</u>
   <u>School</u> in the Canyons School District.
- Ryan Wells, a Spanish teacher at <u>Taylorsville High School</u> in the Granite School District.

A panel with representatives from teachers, parents, charter schools, the Utah State

Board of Education and 2020 Utah Teacher of the Year Lauren Merkley selected the finalists

from among the district and charter school teachers of the year from throughout the state to
select a winning teacher. The announcement will be made on October 1.

The 2021 Utah Teacher of the Year will represent Utah in the National Teacher of the

Year Program in Washington, D.C. and will succeed Merkley, who is an English teacher at

Cottonwood High School in the Granite School District.
