# School Board Training

## **Trust System Overview**



#### Distribution

The first 10% of the district total distribution is divided equally between the 41 districts as a base funding amount. With the inclusion of the base, the distribution formula advantages schools in smaller districts.





The remaining 90% of the district total distribution is divided per pupil then each school receives the district per pupil amount based on enrollment.

#### **School Board Responsibilities**



## **School Community Council Members**

Principal



Serves and is not elected

Parent/Guardian Members



Must have children enrolled at the school for at least one of the two years of their term.

Elected by parents/guardians of students enrolled.

May NOT hold an educator's license AND work at the same school.

School Employee Members



Must be employed at the school and elected by school employees.

## School Community Council Seating



Parent members **must** exceed the number of school employees by at least two members in all schools.

High Schools require 10 council members (unless otherwise outlined in the Rules of Order and Procedure)

- 1 principal
- 3 elected employees
- 6 elected parent members

All other schools require 6 council members (unless otherwise outlined in the Rules of Order and Procedure)

- 1 principal
- 1 elected employee
- 4 elected parent members

## Substantive Changes



Schools will **always** need to submit an amendment to the School LAND Trust Plan for a new goal or new spending category.

Let your schools know when you would like to be notified of a change to the School LAND Trust Plan.

Examples of times when a plan has been amended:

- Changes in current goals
- Creation of new goals
- Significant changes in spending in a category
- Spending that is moved from one category to another, within an existing goal
- Spending that is moved between goals
