

Innovation Proposal: Literary Explorers - Fables, Myths, and Fairy Tales

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Proposed Innovation

Students will build skills in reading, writing, speaking & listening while learning about topics and exploring literature that inspires their interests. Live classes include collaborative writing and learning activities, note taking, exploring literature and nonfiction texts, and games! Students will follow up outside of class with the IEW materials, their own reading reflections, and choices of longer books and projects.

Purpose and Potential

Students will build skills including writing from notes, retelling stories, summarizing, reading and writing personal narratives, responding to literature, and essay writing. They will develop core literacy skills through independent selection in books, audiobook options, and choices in unit-end projects allow teachers to meet each student's current skill level and inspire progress.

Courses Include

A live online class that meets on Monday and Wednesday on one of two time slots.

Student Outcomes

will be measured through formative and summative assessments to track growth measurements and student progress.

Funding

Grant funding will be used for the purchase of books for students.
