Innovation Proposal: ProStart 1 & 2

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Proposed Innovation

This advanced course introduces students to careers in the restaurant industry, covering communication, safety and sanitation, food preparation, meal planning, customer service, and more. By creating and running their own business, students are provided a hands on experience in restaurant and hospitality management.

Purpose and Potential

Students will gain hands-on experiences through running a class business and Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America participation. This prepares students for work in the food industry now and anticipates advanced study in culinary arts. In addition, business skills are integrated into coursework.

Courses Include

an in-person classroom setting on campus in an A or B-day rotating schedule.

Student Outcomes

will be measured through formative and summative assessments to track growth measurements and student progress.

Funding

Grant funding will be used for the purchase of course materials, including small business supplies and consumable goods.
