Innovation Proposal: The Art of Storymaking

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Proposed Innovation

Students will participate in an intensive three-week course intended to foster and develop a love of writing with an emphasis on storytelling principles through novels and poetry. Students will engage with mentor texts, practicing creativity, developing characters and story structures, sprint writing, and small group share circles with feedback on story voice and process.

Purpose and Potential

The goal of this alternative curriculum is to immerse students in all aspects of writing through a positive, focused experience. Students will be given ample time to create a portfolio of 30,000 words, and opportunity to share their work with peers, gaining confidence in both their writing and presentation skills.

Courses Include

a three-week course offered to 9th through 12th graders during the school Winterim period including a focused writing retreat to St. Pleasant, Utah.

Student Outcomes

will be measured with student surveys, writing portfolios, mentor text analysis, group feedback participation, and word count. Students will be challenged to write 30,000 words.

Funding

Grant funding will be used for consumable portfolio materials, writing instruction resources, and to host a creative and welcoming environment.
