

Innovation Proposal: Accelerated Math 2H

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Proposed Innovation

Secondary Math 2H will be offered over the summer at an accelerated rate to allow those students who desire to continue with their math instruction, without the traditional summer break, to be able to move through the content at a faster pace. No standards are skipped, and no learning lost. This saves them years off their college requirements as well as tuition costs.

Purpose and Potential

By offering an accelerated Math 2 in the summer, students are taught all of the new Secondary 2 standards while the Math 1 concepts are fresh in their minds. They can then move onto Math 3 in their sophomore year. This allows them to begin CE math in their junior year, putting them on a trajectory to complete calculus by the time they graduate high school.

Courses Include

an in-person classroom setting on campus that will meet Monday through Thursday from May 20 through mid-July for 2 hours a day.

Student Outcomes

will be measured through 4 unit-exams which require an 80% or higher to pass.

Funding

Grant funding will be used for the creation of Accelerated Math 2H curriculum and to pay the instructors' salaries.

Under House Bill 386, Local Education Agencies can approve up to \$5,000 in grant funding for innovation programs. The innovation outlined here is one example that has been approved for implementation. Learn more at schools.utah.gov/ulead
